

Severe Weather Tips from the National Weather Service

Tornado

- In homes or small buildings:
 - Go to the basement or a small interior room
- Cover your head
- Stay away from windows
- In Mobile Homes or Vehicles
- Do not try to outrun the tornado in your car
- Get to the nearest shelter
- If a shelter is not available, as a last resort, either:
- Stay in the vehicle with your seat belt on. Put your head below the windows and cover your head, or
- Lie flat in a ditch and cover your head

Lightning

- Indoors:
- Stay away from windows and doors
- Turn off the computer
- Stay away from sinks and tubs
- Do not use landline phone
- Do not lie on concrete floors or lean against concrete walls
- Outdoors
- If you can hear thunder, lightning can strike
- Stay away from anything metal
- Stay away from pools and lakes
- Avoid open spaces, but never stand under a tree
- Get to a home or large building

Hurricane

- · Create an emergency supply kit
- Help people in need to prepare for bad weather
- Stay indoors
- Follow local radio/TV stations for weather and specific instructions
- Evacuate the area when instructed by local authorities

Floods

- Move to higher ground and stay away from storm drains, ditches, and streams
- Stay away from flooded areas. Never walk, drive, or swim in flood waters
